## Notes:

Arrived on site at 8:33 on 9-11-2018. It was sunny with temperatures in the 70s. The release occurred south of the central tank battery. Walked along the grassland outside of the dike and saw no impacts. Probed the area with a conductivity probe; however, found readings around 247 uS. There are still some impacts onsite with the contamination being stockpiled there as well; however, on site activities are under the jurisdiction of NDIC. No further follow-up is necessary at this time.
