Transformer oil is unlikely to impact surface water or ground water because of probable incineration. Xcel crews are not allowed onsite at this point, therefore, extent of impacts are currently unknown.

### Action Taken/Planned:

Xcel crews have not been allowed to enter the site because fire crews are still working to put out the fire. Once Xcel personnel are allowed onsite, they will evaluate necessary response. Oil recovery is unlikely as this equipment is in the heart of the fire and all released transformer oil is likely burned up in the fire.
