It is unknown what caused the leak off of the semi truck or which trucking company is responsible. The leak ran off of the cement road and onto a grassed area. There was no odor or staining on the grass. The affected dirt was dug up, which was a very small amount. No water was contaminated. The diesel was cleaned up with floor-dry on the concrete.
