The remaining soils and vegetation did not show any petroleum staining. Replacement soil will be needed for the area excavated. More follow-up needed. Photos added to the incident folder.

On 8/8/2019 at 4:38 PM - Sunny and 78 Degrees F - I visited the Stallion Rockies accident site immediately south of HWY 1804 in Williams County. An excavated area, lacking vegetation, and measuring approximately 10 feet east to west and 2 feet north to south and 2 feet deep was noted within the Hwy 1804 southern ditch. No petroleum odors or stains were noted.
