Arrived on location at 14:10. 50 degrees F, Cloudy, Northwest wind 15-25 mph. Met with a company representative and discussed the incident. The representative had contacted an environmental contractor to attend to the release that afternoon. The release occurred approximately 300' north of the ditch and followed a drainage area on the facility to the ditch on the north side of the road. A barrier had been placed at the first culvert with oil absorbent booms placed on the water at this location. The culvert drained west under the road to another holding area where oil absorbent pads had been placed. It appeared a minimal amount of the oil had made it to the second culvert. Further inspection to the west (down-gradient) did not appear to show any sheen or oily water. Further follow-up needed. Photos added to the incident folder.
