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Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Awards Four Project Loans

BISMARCK, N.D. – The Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Program awarded loans to two cities and two water districts in October.

- Lisbon - \$725,000 to replace 220 lead service lines.
- Mandan - \$1,889,000 towards a project to replace parts of a transmission main as well as upgrade the Collins and Sharon Heights pump stations.
- Stutsman Rural Water District - \$800,000 towards the installation of 46 miles of pipeline from the Woodworth storage tank to Pettibone and Lake Williams, providing water to residents in those communities.
- All Seasons Water Users District - \$1,738,000 towards a project to connect the water source for System 4 to System 1. The water treatment plant and wellfield for System 4 will also be expanded to provide adequate supply for both systems.

The DWSRF Program is administered by the North Dakota Department of Health with funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The program offers below-market interest rate loans to political subdivisions for financing projects authorized under the Safe Drinking Water Act. DWSRF programs operate nationwide to provide the funding necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects and supplies vital water resources.
