

Two cities receive Clean Water State Revolving Fund loans

BISMARCK, N.D. – The North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality announced today that its Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Program awarded loans to two cities in the last three months.

- Rutland - \$205,000 towards emergency lagoon repairs which include new transfer pipes, a discharge pipe and miscellaneous work to ensure the city maintains compliance with its wastewater discharge permit.
- Wing - \$635,000 for rehabilitation of the sanitary sewer mains and manholes so current and future residents continue to have wastewater service.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency provides part of the funding for the CWSRF Program, which offers below-market interest rate loans to political subdivisions for financing projects authorized under the Clean Water Act. CWSRF programs operate nationwide to provide the funding necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects our vital water resources.
