STATE REVOLVING LOAN FUNDS

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Four Drinking Water State Revolving Fund loans awarded

BISMARCK, N.D. – The North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality (NDDEQ) awarded four loans for water projects to four entities through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Program between August and October.

- **Dakota Rural Water District** received a \$1,000,000 loan towards a project which will expand the south water treatment plant and provide the City of Hannaford with drinking water from a rural water system.
- **Dickinson** received a \$2,800,000 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund loan to replace water mains and residential lead service lines, removing a potential source of lead in drinking water.
- **Glen Ullin** was awarded a \$1,900,000 loan to replacement several blocks of cast iron pipe and asbestos cement pipe water mains and to loop any dead-end lines allowing the city to deliver safe drinking water to residents.
- **Riverdale** was awarded a \$600,000 loan towards a project to replace gate valves which will help the city properly operate the water system.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency provides part of the DWSRF Program funding, which offers below-market interest rate loans to political subdivisions for financing projects authorized under the Safe Drinking Water Act. DWSRF programs operate nationwide to provide funding to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects our vital water resources.

Loans are awarded to projects listed on the NDDEQ project priority list based on project eligibility and repayment ability. Please contact the NDDEQ at ndsrf@nd.gov regarding specific detail on any of the projects mentioned above.
