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State Revolving Funds Program's New Wordmark Launch

BISMARCK, N.D. — The North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), in partnership with the North Dakota Public Finance Authority (PFA), today unveiled a fresh wordmark for State Revolving Funds (SRF) program.

Two programs. Two funds. One mission. The new wordmark is an open hand supporting a water droplet symbolizes the programs' shared purpose: uplifting communities through supportive infrastructure.

Since the SRF programs began in 1990, Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) and 1998 Clean Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF), North Dakota has disbursed more than \$2 billion in loans for water and wastewater infrastructure across the state, including more than \$600 million over the past four years.

"The new wordmark reflects how DEQ and PFA work side by side to support the health and future of every North Dakota community," said DeAnn Ament, PFA Executive Director "With more than \$2 billion in funding at below market interest rates, our two programs truly stand for one mission of providing funding to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects our vital water resources."

The state programs are administered jointly by the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality and the North Dakota Public Finance Authority.
