FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

As required by guidelines for the preparation of environmental impact statements, an environmental review has been performed on the proposed action below:

Project: 2022 System Wide Distribution Improvements

Cass Rural Water District (CRWD)

Location: Cass and Ransom Counties, North Dakota

DWSRF Project No.: <u>0901060-07</u>

Total Cost: \$7,948,000.00

The proposed project is for the installation of additional rural water pipe and a new booster pump station. The purpose of these improvements is to improve low pressure areas in the rural water service area. This project will assure that CRWD can continue to serve existing and new residents throughout Cass and Ransom Counties.

CRWD will obtain a Drinking Water State Revolving Fund loan to finance the project. The rural water district has the legal authority and financial and administrative capability to construct the proposed improvements.

The project will primarily disturb agricultural land during the installation of rural water pipe. For a further discussion of this see Item V, Environmental Impacts of Proposed Project in the Environmental Assessment document. Wetlands, area flood plains, threatened or endangered species habitat, or archeological sites will not be adversely impacted. The North Dakota State Historic Preservation Office concurred with the "No Adverse Effect" determination for the proposed project area (ND SHPO Ref.: 21-5144) provided it takes place in the location and manner described in the documentation.

The review process did not indicate significant environmental impacts would result from the proposed action. Consequently, a preliminary decision not to prepare an environmental impact statement has been made. This action is taken on the basis of a careful review of the engineering report, environmental information document, and other supporting data which are on file in the Municipal Facilities Division of the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality.
