

**NOTICE OF SOLICITATION OF VIEWS ON  
STANDARDS OF QUALITY FOR WATERS OF THE STATE**

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality is soliciting comments and will hold a public hearing on the Standards of Quality for Waters of the State, North Dakota Administrative Code Chapter 33.1-16-02.1. The hearing will be held at the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality, 4201 Normandy Street, Bismarck, ND 58503-1324, July 20, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. CST.

The purpose of soliciting comments and holding a public hearing is to begin the review of the Standards of Quality for Waters of the State, as required every three years by federal law, 33 U.S.C. § 1313(c). The triennial review will evaluate the Standards of Quality for Waters of the State to ensure they continue to reflect the best available science to improve and protect the water resources of the state, and to remain consistent with state and federal law.

This hearing will provide an opportunity for citizens and stakeholders to voice concerns and contribute input for considerations in amending the Standards of Quality for Waters of the State. If you plan to attend the public hearing and will need special facilities or assistance relating to a disability, please contact the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality at the above address or telephone number at least seven days prior to the public hearing.
